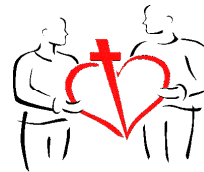

When I attended the funeral of my grandmother in November I started thinking about what we call "Legacy". Thursday afternoon as we sat and listened, better, experienced the life of Dick Logan, I could only think of the word "Legacy". There were (by preacher count) some 300 people in attendance. It was awe-inspiring to experience the legacy of Dick Logan in those moments Thursday afternoon.
